PROCEDURES/RULES

<<<<Please be sure to read this section as some of the procedures/rules have changed>>>>

Participation:

1. The MATTAMEECHEN Merit Badge Fair is open to any registered Boy Scout regardless of district or council affiliation subject to the approval of the event chairperson.
2. All Scouts **MUST** wear the official BSA ("class A uniform"); t-shirts, torn clothing and athletic apparel are not acceptable. **No uniform, no participation and no refund for failing to comply with the rules of the event.**
3. All participants and guests are required to conduct themselves according to the Scout Oath and Law. Any Scout who fails to conduct himself according to these rules will be denied access to the program. **No refund for failing to comply with the rules of the event.**

Fees: Fees for the event:

- If paid/received by CNJC on or before 1/31/2011 - \$10 per day
- If received after, postmarked after 1/31/2011 or at the door - \$15 per day

- CNJC credit card policy requires a minimum charge of \$20. **There will be a \$2 fee to use a credit card for any fee below the minimum.**

Refund Policy:

- No refunds will be issued for amounts of \$10.00 or less for individual fees.
- For individual fees greater than \$10.00, 80% will be refunded if the request is received 2 weeks prior to the date of the activity, training, or program.
- Requests due to a medical or family emergency must be submitted to the Council Office within 30 days of the completion of the event. (Documentation of the emergency will have to be provided.)
- Refunds will not be issued until after the activity, training, or program has been completed.
- All cancellation / refund requests **MUST** be made in writing, be submitted to Joan.Andrews@Scouting.org, and state the reason for the cancellation (e-mail communication is acceptable).
- **All cancellation / refund requests must be copied to the event chair at Matthew.Fernandes@Scouting.org prior to the start of the fair so the space in the merit badge class(es) for which the refund is being requested may be offered to other Scouts. Anyone failing to do so will not be eligible for a refund.**
- **There will be no refunds for pre-ordered lunches once the lunch order has been submitted to the vendor.**

Returned Check Policy: It is the policy of this Council to assess a penalty in the amount of \$25 for insufficient funds when a check is returned to the Council. In addition, if the returned check was received after the posted registration date, late fees will be applied. In the event the Council's bank tried to deposit the check a second time before returning the check, an invoice will be issued for the additional penalty.

Registration Procedures: Complete the registration form neatly and in blue or black ink. Include an e-mail address. Those who do not include an e-mail address will not receive a confirmation. Use the schedules included in this packet to plan your merit badge sessions. Follow the "**Helpful Tips for Success.**" Seats are limited in all merit badge sessions and are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis. Availability is subject to change. Register early to get into the merit badge sessions of your choice. No Scout will be scheduled until payment is received.

Special Scheduling Requests: Scouts who want to be scheduled together should register early and note this request on the registration form. If possible, send the registrations in the same envelope. Every effort will be made to accommodate these requests; however, we cannot guarantee that scouts can be scheduled together. Requests for specific time slots for merit badge sessions will be honored if possible at the discretion of the registrar.

Schedule Changes: Requests for changes in scheduled merit badge sessions after receipt of an e-mail confirmation will be made, if possible, until 2/4/11. After that date, all schedule changes must be made at the scheduling area on the day of the fair and will be subject to availability of the requested merit badge session.

Confirmations: Those who register by 2/4/2011 will receive an e-mail confirmation of the merit badge sessions for which they are scheduled. Confirmations will be sent **ONLY** by e-mail. Later registrations are not guaranteed to receive any confirmation. Registrants for whom none of the requested merit badge sessions can be scheduled will receive notification by e-mail.

PROCEDURES/RULES - CONTINUED

Express Check-In:

Pre-registered Scouts who submit their registrations in advance should go to Express Check-In and receive an envelope containing an event patch, entrance tickets to their scheduled merit badge sessions, a map of the facility and lunch ticket(s) if purchased.

Walk-in Registration:

1. Go to Walk-In Registration, Scouts must submit a completed registration form and pay their registration fee. A receipt will be provided.
2. Take receipt and completed registration form to the scheduling area. Once Merit Badge sessions are scheduled, the Scout will receive a patch, entrance tickets and a map of the facility. If no requested merit badge sessions are available a refund will be issued.

Troop Adult Participation:

At least one adult from each troop with Scouts participating is required to remain at the Merit Badge Fair site in case of an emergency. Tables and seating are provided in the cafeteria. Please be advised that merit badge sessions may be held nearby, so please keep the area quiet. Adults are asked to remain in the cafeteria. Please do not wander around the facilities. If a non-participant is in an inappropriate area, they will be asked to leave.

Expectations – See “Helpful Hints for Success” as not all merit badges can be completed during the time allowed. The MDMBF offers an opportunity to work on merit badges, but not a guarantee of completion based solely on the Scout’s participation in a session. Scouts who come to the merit badge session unprepared will receive credit (partials) for the items completed. Any issues contact the event chairperson at Matthew.Fernandes@Scouting.org.

Requirements (This event follows Merit Badge Requirements in effect as of Dec. 31, 2008):

1. Review the pre-requisites in this packet for each merit badge and plan accordingly.
2. All Scouts are required to bring with them the following items:
 - a. Blue cards for each merit badge session signed by your Scoutmaster or his designee. Blue cards will not be available at the MBF.
 - b. Pre-requisites for your merit badge are listed in this packet. Certain requirements may need verification from Scoutmaster or another adult. Bring a signed letter describing your completion of a requirement to get credit.
 - c. Worksheets for merit badges are available at www.usscouts.org or www.meritbadge.org. (We strongly recommend bringing the official Merit Badge Pamphlets.)
 - d. Paper or notebook
 - e. Writing instrument – pen, pencil
3. Completion of a merit badge is not guaranteed by your attendance. All work required must be done and approved. (Nothing more, nothing less!) Scouts will earn credit for those items completed. Those items will be indicated and signed off on the back of the blue card or on an MDMBF pre-approved form.
4. Scouts will not be permitted to drop off a merit badge packet to a counselor for their review unless they attend the merit badge session for credit. No exceptions.

Food Concessions:

- Food/Drinks/Snacks will be available for purchase each day.
- Discounted lunch deals are available if paid with pre-registration in advance.
- Walk-in lunch orders must be placed during registration at the concession stand.

Scout Shop on the Road

- A limited selection of items appropriate to the event will be sold by the CNJC Scout Shop.

Other Items:

- Medical forms are not required unless they are necessary as a part of a merit badge such as personal fitness.
- Medications, if required, are the sole responsibility of the participant and will not be administered by MBF staff. (If medication needs to be refrigerated, please advise the event chairperson. All medications must be kept in their original containers, labeled with the name of the medication and dosage.)

Helpful Tips for Success

1. Read the Merit Badge Pamphlet and review the requirements in advance to assist you in completing those requirements.
2. Start early and organize yourself, your time, and your materials for each merit badge that you plan to attempt. This includes a merit badge blue card for each merit badge. Consider using a separate pocket folder for each merit badge to contain your materials.
3. If you have access to the Internet, use the worksheets found at the www.usscouts.org and www.meritbadge.org.
4. Make a checklist of items needed to complete each merit badge. Follow this checklist to ensure completion.
5. Before leaving home make sure you have all of the pre-requisites (or as many as possible) so you can be signed off for the work you have completed.
6. Participate during discussion.
7. Make sure you get the completed blue card from the merit badge counselor if you have completed the merit badge or earned a partial. Some Merit Badge Counselors may ask to retain the card in order to take sufficient time to review your printed material.
8. Bring the items required that are listed above in PROCEDURES/RULES and PRE-REQUISITES below.
